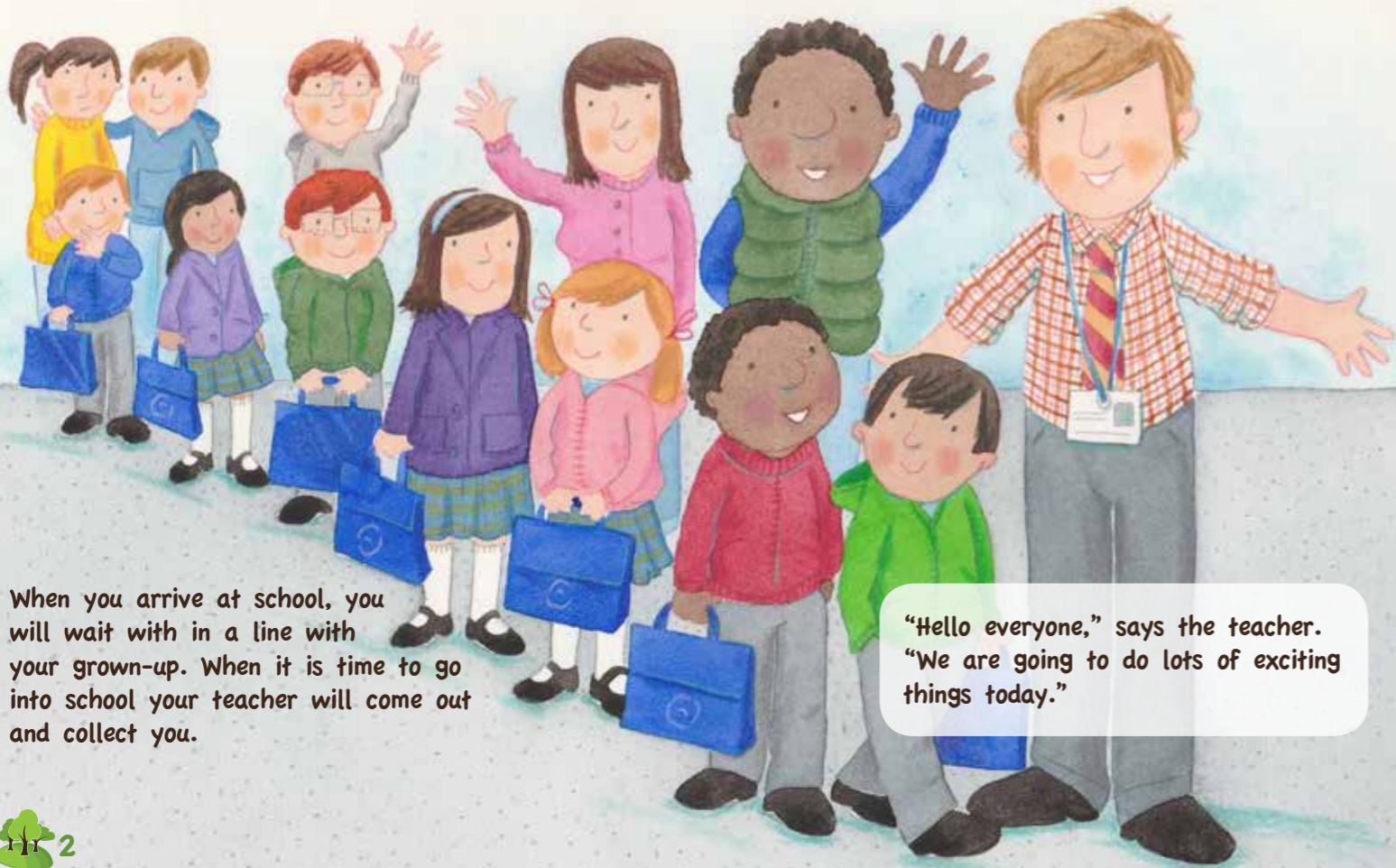


Kwame, Ana and George are coming to Apley Wood Primary School
