Hello from Henry


Henry has been a busy little man again this week. He's been doing his daily spellings, White Rose maths exercises, lots of English work and lovely reading too.


One of his favourite subjects is History so he has really enjoyed researching facts on Anglo-Saxons & Vikings.

Some really impressive work Ethan, and it shows how hard you have worked. Well done and thanks for sharing.










Happy Home Workers














The Final Frontier
