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<u>Headteacher Message</u>

The Apley team are all very excited about welcoming back all children to school on Monday. Our staff have been working very hard planning out the details to ensure the transition back to school for everyone is smooth and as safe as possible. Please remember that it is compulsory for children to return full time from the 8th March.

Our risk assessment has now been updated and added to the website, it is very robust and there are additional measures in place this term. I really do appreciate your support in working with us to keep the virus away from our school. If you are in any doubt about symptoms or possible contacts with positive or symptomatic people, please remember the potential wider impact of risking it by sending your children in to school. You can always contact us for advice if you are unsure. As we are still in lockdown, the national restrictions still say that we can only meet with one other person outdoors, so parents must socially distance during drop off/collection times.

We had a fantastic response from the children about our remote learning questionnaire, and whilst the effort they (and families) have put in with learning at home has been amazing, many of them said they were missing their friends and school staff so we hope that they are as excited as we are in welcoming them back to school. It has been lovely to see how many have attended the live lessons this week, where staff have been explaining what school will be like and answering their questions.








With the re-opening of school on **Monday 8th** March, please can we ask for the return of all borrowed school laptops, to the office, by Thursday 11th March.



Getting Back to School Safely

<u>Help Us Stay Healthy & Open</u>

There are a number of ways in which you can support us to help to keep our children and our school staff as safe as possible from 8th March.

- Please keep to the staggered start and collection times and leave the premises as quickly as
 possible. (we understand that siblings will need to arrive together.)
- For entry to Y4, Y1 and Base 1 please use the one-way system from the main road at the front of school.
- For Y5 and Y6 please use the entrance at the bottom of the playground by the car park as much as possible.
- Base 2, Year 2 and Year 3 please use the entrance through the gates off the Silkin way.
- Only one adult per child on site for drop off/collection. If Y6 children could walk across the
 playground to meet parents by the gates themselves that would help to reduce the congestion
 and number of adults waiting on the playground.
- Please wear a mask when on the school site unless you are exempt.
- Children to bring own water bottle daily. Only school reading books, lunchboxes and water bottles can be brought from home (no school bags please.)
- Teachers will not be able to talk to you easily at the class door, if you have any messages, please call, or email the school office on A2190@taw.org.uk. Teachers will not be able to check emails when they are teaching full time so please do not use the staff email addresses that have been available during remote learning.
- You may want to ensure your children wear additional base layers as windows and doors will be open as much as possible to ensure ventilation is high.
- Children showing any of the primary or secondary symptoms of COVID-19 should not be sent to school and if they develop these during the school day then they will be sent home.
- If any member of your household has any of the primary or secondary COVID-19 symptoms, <u>please do not send your child to school</u>.

We do need your support to help us to keep the virus away from school.


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Little Busy Bodies
