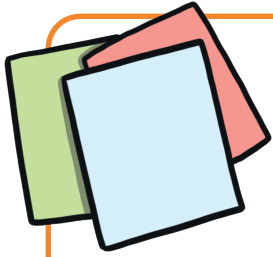


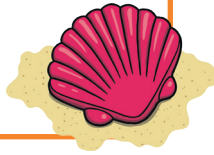
EYFS Maths: Orders Numbers to 20

Home Learning Challenges



Ask a grown-up to help you write all the numbers from 1 to 20 on small pieces of paper to make a set of number cards. You could draw the matching number of spots on to each card too. Then, mix up the cards and see if you can place them in order to create a number line.

Gather a collection of 20 pebbles or shells and use chalk to write a number from 1 to 20 on each one. Place the pebbles or shells in order to create a number path. Say the numbers as you walk along the path.



Go on a number hunt to look for numbers 1 to 20. You could look at numbers on doors, buses, books, food packets, clocks and phones. Take photos of the numbers you find or draw a picture of them. Can you find all the numbers? Can you place them in order?



Ask a grown-up to write numbers from 1 to 20 along a long strip of paper and place a toy over a number. Can you work out the hidden number? You could use the toy to hide a number for your grown-up to work out.



Use building bricks to build a tower. How many bricks did you use? Write a number on each brick and then break up your tower. Give the bricks to a grown-up or friend and see if they can build the same tower by placing the bricks back in order. Ask your grown-up to create another number tower using different coloured bricks for you to try.



Make a set of paper dominoes or use some toy dominoes. Count how many spots are shown on each domino. Can you place the dominoes in order from the smallest number of spots to the biggest number of spots?
